Mission: To enrich lives and strengthen communities through universal access to information and services.

WHAT WE OFFER

Open year-round Monday through Friday; 35 hours per week.

Approximately 820 registered borrowers in Kooskia

- Residents and property owners in the Valnet Service area get free cards
- Non-residents purchase cards for a small fee

Usage in 2024

- Nearly 10,000 visits; more than 800 computer users (does not include patrons with their own laptops who accessed our free 24/7 Wi-Fi during and after library hours)
- Over 4,000 Libby Audio & Ebook Checkouts from Kooskia Patrons
- More than 12,800 items circulated
- Programs: Over 950 people attended 53 programs

In Branch collection of over 6,000 items including audiobooks, kits, DVDs and more.

- New fiction, nonfiction, and audio books regularly added
- Valnet membership gives patrons access to over half a million items.

Print, copy, scan, and fax services with separate fax line

Programming

- Weekly offsite Story Time with Headstart
- Summer reading program

Computer and Internet services

- Two public access desktop computers with Internet access and office software programs
- Wireless Internet service 24/7 with increased bandwidth
- Staff assistance for more accurate research and more efficient use of technology
- Access to free, extensive databases on many subjects via the Idaho Commission for Libraries

CURRENT FACILITY SHORTCOMINGS

Too small

- Just 1,500 square feet
 - Shelving space has reached maximum capacity
 - Public access materials are stored in staff areas due to space limitations
 - No comfortable place to sit and read or wait
 - No space for designated areas (I.e. Teen Zone, Reference, Children's etc.)
 - Limited space for programming on site
 - No meeting space for groups
 - No quiet private space for individuals to work on read
 - Limited work space for library staff and the public
 - Inadequate storage space
 - Inadequate space for public use computers

WHAT WE CAN OFFER

...WITH A BIGGER, BETTER DESIGNED FACILITY OF OUR OWN

More books and materials

- With adequate shelving space, can keep and add many more materials
- Shelving is easily accessible to all patrons
- Shelving is flexible: interior shelves are on wheels so they can be moved into different configurations or out of the way for events
- Add local history section and designated sections to meet the needs of children, teens and adults.

A more attractive, comfortable, and safe children's area

- More books and educational materials
- Designed for children and parents to enjoy learning and spending time together
- Designed to be easily accessed and monitored by a one-person staff

More public-access computers

- Increase number of public access computers
- More comfortable and ergonomic
- Designed to make it easy for distance learning/working
- Top-of-the-line technology and software

Better designed seating and easy wireless printing for wireless computer users

- Indoor work spaces with built-in power supply so laptop users can recharge their computers
- Comfortable, durable outdoor seating and access to power for after-hours use
- High-speed printer/copier/scanner/fax helps meet diverse needs of locals and travelers
- Provides important service for visitors.

Attractive, comfortable spaces for reading, socializing, and learning

- A comfortable, quiet place to read periodicals or books
- A destination where community members feel welcome and connected
- Built-in display spaces for rotating art or cultural exhibits

Built-in work space for library staff and the public

- Comfortable Tables and chairs for patrons to conduct research or study
- Separate staff work space for processing materials, preparing adult and children's activities, and conducting administrative work

High-tech multipurpose room for serving various size groups

- Comfortable place for Library events and public meetings.
- Flexible room for patrons working on projects requiring more space or privacy
- Can host cultural and social events such as a film festival, lecture series, or craft fair
- Events or meetings can be held while the library is open without impacting other users.
- Technology such as a projector, screen, speaker system, etc. makes room more versatile for high-tech.
- Addition of Makerspace - a collaborative workspace to facilitate creativity and learning using a variety of tools and mediums.
- Addition of teaching kitchen
- Secure entrance and key-pad lock provides access to meeting space after hours

Built-in storage space

- More equipment and supplies are available for Library and other groups' use
- Ensures donations of books and equipment are put to good use
- Decreases clutter and improves safety

Outdoor space

- Plenty of off-street parking
- Easy and safe access from the parking lot to the door for all patrons in all weather
- Outdoor landscaping takes advantage of local vegetation and conserves water
- Outdoor patio meets needs of after-hours users
- On site outdoor programming space to enhance and increase program availability.

Eliminate cost of rent

- Use the saved funds to provide more services, offer special events and programs, and supplement a long-term maintenance fund
